

Errata sheet,

No matter how much you proofread ... there are always a few dratted errors. Sorry for the inconvenience – I really tried, I assure you.

You might want to note them in your own book, but I was not comfortable scribbling in a book that does not belong to me.

If you find other typos or errors, please let me know (kiles@island.net). I have noted errors that I thought might be misleading, although really trivial spelling errors, etc. have been ignored. I will add this errata sheet to my website in the near future.

Page 8 - This I will not immediately reveal. It is my entry into the Guinness Book or records on the worst typo ever (and my mother was a proof-reader at the local paper – she would skin me).

Page 22 - second page 24 should be 27, and next topic page 36 should be 30 (This happens because the markers carrying page numbers are invisible, and can get shifted during the final editing to adjust spacing on pages).

Page 190

50% t-value was 0.688 in each case (the first was shown as 0.687, then again as 0.688).

Page 315 – footnote should read “5.08”, not “5.03”

Page 385, line 4, ft²/acre - dropped or transposed numbers (correct in spreadsheet) should be:

<u>23</u> ,087.	not	<u>3</u> ,087.

Page 426 (example 10.14),

Correct in the EXCEL example, but in the text the BAF should be 40, and the line length 10 feet.

Page 593, top - should therefore read “When ~~the middle term~~ the FPC correction is small, ...”

Page 505, **23.78** should obviously be 21.78, caused by incorrectly solving 47,560/2000 rather than 43,560/2,000 as stated correctly in the book. It’s always the easy ones that you miss. My thanks to Eli Shank for pointing out this sloppy error on my part.

Page 638, footnote - The paper on the walkthrough method was finally published in Forest Science in August, 2004. A copy can probably be obtained from the internet.
